#### Council Update – In March 2018, Council:

- reported on 2017 legal expenses
- appointed Snaw-Naw-As (Nanoose) First Nation Councillor Tom Bob to the Economic Development Strat. Plan & Community Branding Select Committee
- authorized the CAO to sign the new Collective Agreement with CUPE Local 401
- directed staff to prepare a new Water Connection Allocation Policy, including order of priority criteria
- instructed staff to refer the Draft Official Community Plan (OCP), as amended, to referral agencies for preliminary feedback prior to Council consideration of first reading of a new OCP bylaw
- directed staff to investigate and report on compliance with setbacks, the existing and draft OCP, and DP Area requirements; disposal plans; and why parkland dedication areas were cut, for the properties clear cut on Superior Road, Ware Road and Ronald Road
- appointed Trudy Coates as Chief Election Officer and Joan Harrison as Deputy CEO for the 2018 Election
- responded with no objections to the RDN amending the RDN Regional Growth Strategy Bylaw No. 1615, 2011 to implement the RDN Electoral Area 'H' OCP Amendment Bylaw No. 1335.6, 2017 through the minor amendment process
- requested a meeting with the Finance Minister regarding the application of the BC Speculation Tax to residential properties in the District of Lantzville
- directed staff to provide an analysis of tree regulation bylaws and related costs in similar-sized municipalities, and the feasibility of protection within development permit area regulations
- instructed staff to provide additional information regarding the Water Rate Comparison calculation
- requested staff prepare a report on the minimum parcel size allowed for a subdivision in process
- resolved to consider the progress of the Foothills development negotiations in relation to the covenant
- requested a meeting with City of Nanaimo Council to discuss proposed changes to the Water Agreement
- directed staff to report on background to the new development clause 6.6 in the Water Agreement
- appointed Jim Plasteras to the Parks and Recreation Commission for a term ending December 2020.

#### Sanitary Sewer Phase III Project Update

As reported in last year's O&A document, connection for properties in the Phase III Local Service Area is estimated to be available in 2019 or 2020. Project Update: Our engineers' work on the design will likely take another two or three months. When the design is complete, the Community Planner or Director of Public Works will contact the owners of property within the Phase III area, where necessary, to acquire easements (estimated to take another two or three months). After all of the easements are in place, the final design can be completed (estimate another month). As the design is finalized, a tender will be prepared and advertised at least one month. If tender results go to Council for award sometime in October or November, works could begin in late 2018/early 2019 in lower Lantzville, gradually making its way to upper Lantzville mid-2019. #### **BYLAW REMINDERS**

Outdoor burning – From October 16<sup>th</sup> to May 14<sup>th</sup>, residents are permitted to burn in their backyards without a permit. Conditions apply. Confirm before you burn! Call Ministry of Environment at 1.888.281.2992 and follow the prompts to hear Environment Canada's daily ventilation index for Central Vancouver Island to confirm if burning is permitted. Outdoor burning is restricted when the index is POOR or FAIR. The conditions must be GOOD on the day you burn and GOOD or FAIR the following day in order to burn per the burning bylaw. A clear sunny day is NOT a reliable indicator – you must check the ventilation index. Burn materials as hot as possible (to reduce smoke and ash), burn infrequently and ONLY when venting permits, so the smoke goes straight up. Fire supervision, size of fire and burn materials are also regulated. Comply with Bylaw No. 86 and 86.1 (lists prohibited materials). An open air fire (aka burn pile, bonfire, backyard fire) is for yard cleanup - no prohibited materials may be burned. #### **Water Main Flushing Continues**

Between March 15<sup>th</sup> and April 15<sup>th</sup> the District's water system will undergo annual routine maintenance, including flushing of waterlines to remove sediment and maintain good water quality, as well as fire hydrant maintenance. Flushing is achieved by releasing water in the mains through fire hydrants and stand pipes. This causes a bubbling of air which may discolour the water. No chemicals are added to the system. While this should not affect the quality of drinking water, we recommend that laundry be done on weekends or evenings to avoid possible discolouration of clothes, etc. Our apologies for any inconvenience.

#### **Attention Tennis & Pickleball Enthusiasts**

Time to pick up your racket and head to the tennis court on School Road! Last Fall, the District painted pickleball lines on the tennis court on School Road so players of both sports (at different times, of course) can use the facility and maximize the underutilized court. We look forward to seeing more players (from both sports!) enjoying the tennis court.

# Mountain Bike Skills Circuit at Rotary Park Needs Sunshine Before Work Completion

The mountain bike skills circuit contractor reports they (Hoots Inc.) need at least one to two weeks of good weather to dry out the pump track, so it can be compacted. After compaction is complete, the bike park will be open to the public.
