Report Street Lights Requiring Repair

These dark winter nights, if you notice a street light on a wooden pole that is not working properly, please submit a repair request to the District of Lantzville and we will contact BC Hydro on your behalf. BC Hydro will strive to complete your repair request within 10 business days. When submitting the street light repair request (email district@lantzville.ca), please provide as much detail as possible including:

- Address, location or nearby cross street where the street light is located
- Pole serial number, if known, and nature of the problem (for example, street light out, cycling on and off, dim).

BYLAW REMINDERS


Effective November 1st – No water restrictions in effect until April 2021.

Open Burning – Until April 15, 2021, Open Air and Incinerator fires are permitted only IF every reasonable alternative for reducing, reusing or recycling debris has been pursued first to minimize the amount of debris to be burned and subject to Bylaw No. 185 regulations. No prohibited materials may be burned (e.g., no demolition waste, household waste, treated lumber, etc.). Burn only clean, dry organic materials, in a fire less than 1.2 metres high by less than 1.8 metres in diameter, and subject to venting index. Call 1.888.281.2992 or visit the Ministry website (www.env.gov.bc.ca/epd/epdpa/venting) and search the daily Ventilation Index for CNTRL VAN ISLD at the bottom of the page to confirm if burning is GOOD, otherwise burning is prohibited. NO OPEN FIRES ARE PERMITTED ON ANY BEACH AT ANY TIME OF THE YEAR - only portable propane campfire apparatus (CSA or ULC approved) are permitted on the beach between the hours of 11:00 am to 8:00 pm. NO LANDCLEARING FIRES ARE PERMITTED AT ANY TIME OF THE YEAR except registered burns on ALR lands Oct 15th-Nov 15th. Fireworks Restricted – The District of Lantzville prohibits setting off fireworks, except on Halloween. No person under the age of 18 is permitted to possess fireworks. The sale of fireworks and use of firecrackers are prohibited in Lantzville. Fines start at \$150. For more information, view Fireworks Regulation Bylaw No. 39, 2005 at www.lantzville.ca.
