# Salish Sea Gull Project 2023 Fieldwork Outreach

If you are visiting our parks and beaches this winter, you may see researchers from Environment and Climate Change Canada studying gulls (often commonly referred to as "seagulls") between January and March. These scientists are measuring the habitats, diets, and contaminant levels of gulls across the Salish Sea in support of assessments of the health of this important ecosystem. Glaucous-winged Gulls and California Gulls will be temporarily captured to band, sample, and attach GPS tracking devices. Each gull will receive a unique colour band combination as a method to measure age-specific survival and track movements through time. You can support this work by reporting sightings of colour-banded gulls using this form: bit.ly/3vIThW3. The project is a collaboration between Environment and Climate Change Canada, Simon Fraser University, Fisheries and Oceans Canada, and the University of Lethbridge. All work will be conducted under the appropriate federal permits and federal

# Electric Vehicle Charging Station at Municipal Hall Available for Public Use



Thanks to funding through a grant to the Regional District of Nanaimo (RDN) from the Provincial CleanBC Communities Fund to install 10 new public electric vehicle (EV) charging stations in the RDN, the District of Lantzville has a new Level 2 EV charging station in the Municipal Hall parking lot available for public use! The District gratefully acknowledges the financial support for this project from the Province of British Columbia through the Ministry of Energy, Mines and Low Carbon Innovation through the CleanBC Go Electric Public Charger Program.

The new ChargePoint EV charging station at Municipal Hall (LANTZVILLE MUN HALL 1) is part of a larger investment in EV chargers across mid-Vancouver Island to help fill existing gaps in the area's charging network and to expand zero emission transportation options for residents, businesses and visitors. Electric vehicles greatly reduce vehiclerelated greenhouse gases.

## Lantzville Fire Rescue Has a New Rescue Mini-Pumper

Rescue 3 is now in service and responding to calls in Lantzville!

Rescue 3 is a 2022 F550 4x4 mini rescue pumper. This truck has a 1,250 gpm fire pump and a 239-gallon water tank. Rescue 3 will be used as a first responder vehicle for medical calls and will respond to motor vehicle incidents. This truck was designed to be more maneuverable than



our larger fire engines so that it could get into some of the limited access driveways we have in the District. It also will be a great asset in the winter to reach emergencies that may occur where a 4X4 vehicle is required. This unit will be going around the community identifying limited access driveways to be entered into our dispatch system, so we can ensure the appropriate response.

The start time of the open portion/livestreaming of the meeting may vary if a closed portion is required at the beginning of the regular Council meeting. Please refer to the Council meeting agenda, published the week before the meeting, to confirm the open portion/livestream start time.

Council members may attend in person, or electronically (except for the Mayor) for a hybrid meeting, or via Zoom Webinar for an Electronic Meeting (per the Community Charter and the Council Procedure Bylaw). The Council Procedure Bylaw defines an Electronic Meeting as a meeting where all attendees participate electronically. Participation will be managed electronically via Zoom, operated from the Council Chambers. Public Hearings are held electronically (per the Local Government Act) to provide greater access, transparency and convenience. Zoom also offers the option to dial in by phone. For Electronic Meetings (e.g., meetings with Public Hearings), in accordance with the Community Charter, the Council Chamber is open (with limited seating) for those unable to participate electronically to attend and a designated municipal officer must be in attendance. For in person and hybrid meetings the Council Chamber is also open for the public to attend. Due to limited seating, the public is encouraged to view the open portion of the meeting via the livestream (advance registration is not required), and to provide verbal public input on agenda items by registering in advance using the Zoom Webinar link provided for each Council meeting event at lantzville.ca OR written comments by noon the day of the meeting. Prior to attending at Municipal Hall, please self-assess to ensure you are healthy and do not attend if you are ill. Members of the public must remain seated unless invited to address Council. Meetings recorded by the District of Lantzville may be viewed at lantzville.ca.

#### Tree Protection Bylaw No. 332 Under Development

The Community Charter provides that a local government is allowed to prohibit and/or regulate the cutting of trees by bylaw. On Wednesday, January 11, 2023, Council gave "District of Lantzville Tree Protection Bylaw No. 332, 2022" first reading and referred the motion for second reading to a special Council meeting. Bylaw No. 331 was adopted last November to prohibit the cutting of trees with a trunk greater than 20 centimetres, on parcels of land greater than one (1) acre in size, while the District developed a more comprehensive bylaw to present to the community. Bylaw No. 332 is intended to repeal and replace "District of Lantzville Tree Protection Bylaw No. 331, 2022" that was adopted November 5, 2022. Council plans to propose edits for Bylaw No. 332 at the 6:00 pm January 30th special Council meeting before scheduling public input that would be in addition to the public input provided at each Council meeting.

### Five Year Financial Plan 2023 - 2027

Council's review of the 2023 - 2027 Financial Plan continues at special Council meetings February 6th and 13th, working towards bylaw adoption. The public is invited to provide feedback either in writing or by providing public input in person or remotely during the Council meetings. Members of the public who wish to provide input regarding agenda items can submit written comments by email to district@lantzville.ca, mail or drop off at Municipal Hall, and MUST be received before 12:00 noon on the Council meeting date, providing your name, address, agenda item number/name, and comment. Council does not accept anonymous submissions (this includes e-mails with an e-mail address only). All written submissions, including names and addresses, will become part of the public record, be shared with Council, and posted at lantzville.ca.

#### **Emergency Planning**

Stormy season is here! Wind and snow can knock down branches and powerlines. Downed powerlines may still be electrified and can be very dangerous. If you see a downed powerline, you should:

- 1. Stay back at least 10 metres (that's about 35 feet, or the length of a transit bus) from the power line, and any object that the line touches;
- 2. Call 9-1-1 to report the downed powerline; and
- 3. Keep others at least 10 metres away from the downed line.

Here's a few tips to help you and your family prepare for power outages:

- Have a battery-operated radio so you can listen in to local radio stations for warnings and instructions
- Stow flashlights with extra batteries somewhere easy to grab
- If you have a wood or gas fireplace, regularly inspect your chimney or flue to ensure smoke and other potentially harmful gases are properly ventilated
- Never use barbecues or camp stoves indoors. These can give off harmful gases that can hurt you if not properly ventilated
- Register for Voyent Alert, to keep up to date with emergency alerts and information, by visiting <u>www.rdn.bc.ca/emergency-alerts</u>.

# Bylaw Reminders

Open Burning – Until April 15, 2023, Open Air and Incinerator fires are permitted ONLY IF every reasonable alternative for reducing, reusing or recycling debris has been pursued first to minimize the amount of debris to be burned and subject to Bylaw No. 185 regulations and the Ventilation Index. No prohibited materials may be burned (e.g., no demolition waste, household waste, treated lumber, etc.). Burn only clean, dry organic materials in a fire less than 1.2 m high by less than 1.8 m in diameter and subject to the venting index. Check out the Ventilation Index Forecast widget at lantzville.ca BEFORE you burn! The forecast is issued every morning by the Province. NO LANDCLEARING FIRES ARE PERMITTED AT ANY TIME OF THE YEAR except registered burns on ALR lands Oct 15th - Nov 15th. Small campfires used for cooking, heating or ceremonial purposes are allowed (except on beaches) subject to conditions. NO OPEN FIRES ARE PERMITTED ON ANY BEACH AT ANY TIME OF THE YEAR; only portable propane campfire apparatus (CSA or ULC approved) are permitted on the beach between the hours of 11:00 am - 8:00 pm. At any time, a representative of Lantzville Fire Rescue may demand that a fire be extinguished. Every person who ignites, or permits to be ignited, any fire, is responsible for that fire and is liable for all expenses incurred by the District to respond to that fire. ### 2023 Business Licence Required

It is unlawful for a person to engage in or carry on a business within Lantzville unless that person holds a valid business licence issued by the District of Lantzville. The requirement to hold a District of Lantzville business licence includes non Lantzville based business operators who also hold a licence in the municipality where their business has an office, business address or is normally based. The Miscellaneous Fees and Charges Bylaw No. 26 establishes the business licence fee (\$100/each premise in Lantzville for non-Lantzville-based and Lantzville-based business except Home based business whose fee is \$50.00) and renewal fees. # Discourage Playing in the Ditches!

Although ditches can appear harmless, it's important to teach your children that ditches are not a safe place to play. The purpose of ditches is to move runoff from roadways and private property. At times of heavy rainfall, the water in ditches can move very quickly! Whether dry or filled with water, many ditches have garbage or debris that could pose a hazard. And when filled with water, the banks of ditches are very slippery – if someone falls in, they can't easily get out! Encourage your children to find a safe place to play.

## Fire Rescue Safety Message

This month's Fire Rescue message: Please make it easy for emergency responders to find your house – install reflective or illuminated house numbers. Drive by your own house in the dark – is your house number visible from the street, driving from both directions? Safety Tip: Your earthquake preparedness kit should last you one week. Don't forget to include medications!
