New Requirements for Short Term Rentals

All Short Term Rentals (ex. AirBnB, VRBO) require a Lantzville Business License to operate.

In addition, as of May 1, the Province of BC requires all Short Term Rental hosts to register with the new Provincial registry and display a provincial registration number on their online listing. Hosts who do not have a provincial registration number will have their listings taken down as of June 1, 2025. Did You Feel the Earthquake in Lantzville?

A minor magnitude 5.1 earthquake took place at 1:26pm on Friday Feb.21, 2025 centered near Sechelt, BC. Many residents of Lantzville felt the shockwave.

Spring Ahead & Check Your Smoke Alarms!

Daylight saving time will begin on Sunday, March 9 at 2:00am. When the clocks "spring forward" sunrise and sunset will occur one hour later.

With the time change, it is good practice to check your smoke alarms are functioning, replace batteries and any outdated devices. Every home in BC is required by law to have a working smoke alarm. Test using the test button and maintain and replace following the manufacturer's instructions.
